Behavioral Data Report**

Elementary Incidents

September 9 - September 30, 2019

17 incidents involving 8 different students

September 8 - September 30, 2020

12 incidents involving 7 different students

The severity of some of these incidents are of concern compared to the previous year. In general there have been some students who have shown regression, one can assume that is due to the closure. With that said there have also been students who have continued their growth and remain on my radar but not my focus.

Middle School Incidents

September 9 - September 30, 2019

2 incidents involving 2 students

September 8 - September 30, 2020

5 incidents involving 4 students

There has also been regression in some middle school students' behavior. Much of that behavior is more similar to their specific behavior from the 2018-19 school year. Again, there are also students who have made positive strides and benefit from coming into middle school.

High School Incidents

September 9 - September 30, 2019

28 incidents involving 17 students

September 8 - September 30, 2020

8 incidents involving 4 students

High school has shown the most positive growth following the closure. Some of that is likely attributed to their desire to socialize with their peers.

Additional noteworthy information - Morning bus incidents have declined which seemingly supports having a daily bus monitor on each bus.
